Romans 9:1-3

Rom 9:3 For I could wish that myself were accursed from Christ for my brethren, my kinsmen according to the flesh:

Mania: Denoting a specified type of mental abnormality or obsession.

Acts 21:5-13

What is involved in Taking the Gospel Ship? (v. 6)

1) It Effects your Family (v. 5)

*Some of your family will go with you, but some will stay on shore!

*There's a place in your walk with God that your family either cannot or will not go!

*Sometimes the family just "can't go there", because it is too intense for them.

*Serve God, and love your family anyway! Ultimately, follow HIS lead!!

*And THANK GOD for those family members who are ON BOARD with you!!!

2) It Requires Flexibility (vs. 4, 6-11)

*Lots of travel, lots of destinations, lots of change.

*Same God, same Spirit, different environments along the journey.

*Stay when He says stay, and go when He says go!

*Stay in Sync with God's will for your life and ministry, and you'll always be in the right place at the right time for the right purpose!

*God will hook you up with the right people in your life during those Divine moments!

*Never under-estimate the voices that God puts in your life...there's a reason they are there!

3) It Takes Fervor (vs. 12-13)

*Ferver: intense and passionate feeling

*Paul was not only willing, but READY, to die for Christ!

*Paul's passion for Christ far surpassed any fear of rejection or martyrdom.

*Christians who are not passionate for Christ, never do anything for Christ!

*Where is the FIRE in your heart for God?

*When you let others rob you of your zeal for God, you have made them an idol in your heart, answering to them, instead of God!

*Who are you serving, God, or that person you let talk you out of serving Him???

Lastly, you NEVER stop learning!

Act 21:16 There went with us also *certain* of the disciples of Caesarea, and brought with them one Mnason of Cyprus, an old disciple, with whom we should lodge. **Psa 34:3** O magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt his name together.
